

Will Signing Instructions



A Will becomes legally valid and binding as soon as it is correctly signed by the Testator and observed by two Witnesses together, who will sign to confirm this fact. It is important that you **SIGN AND DATE** your Will in front of two Witnesses as soon as possible, **BUT PLEASE READ THE REST OF THIS PAGE FIRST.**

An example of how to sign your Will

1. The signing of your Will involves **THREE** people, you and **TWO** Witnesses.
2. All **THREE** must be present throughout the process.
3. The **WITNESSES** must be over **18** years old.
4. Make sure that the Witnesses are as **independent** as possible. Ideal Witnesses could be neighbours or colleagues.
5. The **WITNESSES** must **NOT** be Beneficiaries, spouses of Beneficiaries or members of your own family (signing as a Witness means that they will lose their inheritance).
6. Ask your two **WITNESSES** to add their "usual" signatures, where appropriate.
7. They should also print their **names, addresses and occupation** clearly for identification purposes.
